COURSES

The online training programme comprises:

1

Protocols for recording reports of gender-based violence by victims and assessing the need for protective measures during the investigation

2

Pre-trial risk assessment to determine the need for injunctions or orders to protect victims

3

Use of alternatives to trial and summary criminal proceedings

4

Application of case theory in the investigation of gender-based violence

5

Gender-sensitive approach in the prosecution of gender-based violence

The face-to-face course localises the content (laws, jurisprudence, context), featuring an online animated case.

How does it work?

Online component: self-directed and self-paced, with tutorials and discussion forums

Face-to-face component: practical exercises carried out in groups using localised cases

Who is the training programme intended for?

Criminal justice officials and staff concerned with cases of gender-based violence, including those from public prosecutor's offices, courts, tribunals and offices providing support and legal representation to survivors of gender-based violence.

Participants will be selected by their institution, according to transparent pre-established criteria, and certified by the JSCA.

How long does it take to complete?

Online component: approximately 30 hours over the course of two months

Face-to-face component: approximately 20 hours distributed over two or three sessions
