S.I.C. has the objective of fostering job-effective growth while improving social and environmental sustainability in Ethiopia's manufacturing sector.

Through its implementation, the S.I.C. project is supporting the participation of promising companies to show case their products at fairs as well as organise buyer-seller targeted meetings and trade missions. In addition, oneto-one matchmaking of companies is initiated based on concrete product requests from buyers and investors.
