- Support the agricultural team in data collection and analysis together with the M&E unit of the project.
- Support in the coordination between different components of the project (e.g. forestry, land use planning) regarding the
  overall project implementation and cross-cutting activities.
- Support in the organisation of events, meetings or other formats within the project and together with project owners on
  provincial and district level.
- Support the agricultural team in reporting to the management as well as donors and other stakeholders.
- Act as the communication focal point for the agricultural team including the development of fact sheets, presentations and other PR materials.
- Provide interpretation and translation services from Lao to English and vice versa.

- At least a Bachelor's degree in agriculture, rural development, environmental science or related fields.
- At least 2 years professional working experience in a comparable position.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills in English and Lao.
- Working experience with an international organization.
- Good working knowledge on sustainable, climate-smart and/or de-forestation free agricultural value chains.
- Very good working knowledge with information and communication technologies (incl. MS Office, GPS, GIS).
- Experience working on village level and with governmental institutions.
