The training sessions will equip agricultural businesses with the skills and knowledge to engage in agrotourism, a rapidly growing sector that is diversifying the local economy. Agrotourism offers a range of benefits, including the creation of new jobs, the preservation of local culture and traditions, and the promotion of sustainable agriculture practices. By participating in our training sessions, participants will be part of a growing movement that is diversifying the local economy and promoting rural development in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq.

Agricultural Tourism Development in KRI project:

Training program:

The first phase the project will train professionals on Agrotourism know-how as experts. These Innovation Coaches will act as local experts and focal points with the mission to activate agrotourism in KRI! In the second phase Agricultural Businesses will learn how to provide visitors with an unforgettable agrotourism experience, including farm visits, culinary experiences, cultural activities, and much more. These potential entrepreneurs will receive training in Agritourism and ongoing coaching support to develop business plans.

The project aims at 3 key outputs:

- 1. Trained Agritourism Innovation Coaches
- Basic training for potential Agritourism enterprises
- 3. Advanced business plan development and coaching for Agritourism enterprises

Opportunities

The project will open two calls for expressions of interest.

Agrotourism Innovation Coach program

The project will train agrotourism innovation coaches. These individuals will receive training in agrotourism market opportunities in the KRI, and coaching skills. Successful trainees will have opportunities to be contracted by the project for provision of training and coaching services to potential agrotourism entrepreneurs.

Agrotourism enterprises training program

The project will train a wide range of interested stakeholders in agrotourism market opportunities in the KRI. Business people involved in tourism, hospitality, and agricultural activities interested to grow their market are welcome to apply to participate in trainings.
